file this Expedited Motion to Begin Limited Discovery.

The plaintiffs, in their motion to remand, dispute the proposed alignment of Leslie Cagan, Tomas Moran and Peter Bramson, Robert Robinson and Rabbi Aaron Kriegel, as plaintiffs. The alignment of these parties affects whether this action can be removed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. 1441. See Famous Amos Chocolate Chip Cookie Corporation v. Radack, 1993 WL 21496 (N.D. Cal. 1993) (recognizing the right of parties to engage in limited discovery to determine the proper alignment of parties.) Civil Local Rule 16-3(b) specifically provides that a party may seek to begin discovery by expedited motion pursuant to Civil L.R. 7-10 when "necessary to prepare for a jurisdictional or venue motion." Both the Ninth Circuit and this Court consistently have recognized that, where jurisdictional facts are disputed, parties should be allowed to conduct discovery for the limited purpose of establishing those facts before the claims before the Court can be dismissed. See Siderman v. Republic of Argentina, 965 F.2d 699, 713 (9th Cir. 1992); see also Souza v. Northwest Mortgage, Inc., C.A. C-96-1641-VRW, 1997 WL 220325 (N.D. Cal. 1997).

The plaintiffs' principal challenge to the realignment of Cagan, Moran, Bramson, Robinson and Kriegel does not challenge the substantive merits of the Foundation Defendants' factual representations. The challenge is based on the extrinsic nature of the evidence submitted to this Court. That technical concern can be resolved through the limited discovery requested by this Motion. Therefore, the Foundation Defendants seek leave to take discovery respecting the proper alignment of Cagan, Moran, Bramson, Robinson and Kriegel.
