Scene is the KPFA radio station located on the east side of Martin Luther King Jr. Way, just south of Berkeley Way. The location has been the site of a prolonged labor dispute and employee terminations which have resulted in protests and several arrests over the past couple of weeks.

At approximately 1800 hours, Tuesday, July 13, 1999, officers were dispatched to the radio station to reports of a disturbance caused when management terminated an employee.

Upon arriving, officers determined that an employee identified as Dennis Bernstein had been terminated. Shortly after being fired, Bernstein was able to go live on radio and announce his termination to the listening audience. As a result, between 60 and 70 individuals who were part of a larger protest outside the station, stormed through the locked doors and took over the bottom floor of the business.

Upon my arrival I contacted a General Manager of Pacific Radio Station, the parent company to KPFA, one Garland Ganter. Ganter stated that he was sent from his office in Houston, Texas, and was currently in charge of the KPFA radio station in Berkeley.

Ganter stated that he had terminated Bernstein shortly after he (Bernstein) completed his on-air show for violating company policies. Ganter stated that after being notified of his dismissal, Bernstein was able to go back live on-air and went into a tirade about be fired and even being physically attacked.

At the same time, a peaceful demonstration was being conducted in front of the business of about 100 people. As several protestors had portable radios, the termination of Bernstein and the subsequent on-air broadcast was heard by the crowd.

Ganter stated that the front doors to the business were locked by a dead bolt lock and electronically activated steel arms that went across both double doors. Ganter said that suddenly the doors were pulled open and about 60-70 individuals rushed into the building shouting and screaming.

Much later in the night after the numerous arrests and the first floor secured, I examined the front double doors and observed the steel arm on the left swinging door was hanging on one end by a single screw and the dead bolt pulled away from the door and laying on the floor. The doors were unable to be locked and at the end of the event, had to be secured by plywood.

Ganter demanded that the protestors inside the private business be arrested. I informed Ganter that any arrests would have to be initiated by himself as a citizen's arrest for trespassing. He agreed saying he would do whatever was necessary to get the people out of the building or make arrests if they refused.

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I then instructed two officers to walk to the outside of the building and secure the two double doors and station themselves outside to prevent anyone else from entering. This was done without incident which isolated approximately 60 people inside from the remaining outside crowd.

At approximately 1945 hours, using a police bullhorn, and having the entire event videotaped, I advised the crowd inside the building that they were trespassing on private property and that management wished them to leave. I further announced that if they refused to leave that they would all be arrested for trespassing by citizen arrest of the management.

The crowd responded by loud chants and screaming in an attempt to mute what I was attempting to announce.

Approximately 10 minutes later I once again ordered the crowd to leave or face arrest and indicated that those who decided to leave could come forward and they would be escorted out the side door. Approximately 10-12 individuals did come forward and were guided out the side door onto Berkeley Way. Again, the activity continued to be videotaped by an ID Technician.

The remaining group, which numbered around 50, either stood in the doorway or sat interlocking their arms. Using the same bullhorn, Ganter announced as he was instructed by myself, which was videotaped, that he was placing all the individuals under arrest for trespassing.

Using two officers per individual subject, arrests were physically initiated at approximately 2000 hours. Three subjects were peacefully removed from the business and placed into the prisoner van parked on Berkeley Way, east of Martin Luther King.

As the fourth and fifth subjects were being ushered out of the business, the crowd of protestors that had formed on Berkeley Way had grown to about 300-400. The crowd surrounded the two teams of officers with their prisoners and began pushing and shoving them while some attempting to pull the prisoner from the officer's grasp.

The officers called for additional help and myself and several officers exited the building at the side door. We were able to push through the crowd and pull the four officers and two prisoners to their safety back inside the business. I was able to observe that the tall prisoner transportation van that now contained three prisoners was being rocked back and forth in what was believed to be an attempt to tip the van over. Two officers who were stationed at the van were severely outnumbered and were unable to intervene.

I then called for all available police units to respond Code 3 to the scene in order to protect the officers that had been stranded around the van and the prisoners inside who would be injured.

Within a few minutes, approximately 20-30 officers assembled at the corner of Martin Luther King and Berkeley Way. The group of officers contained personnel from Berkeley P.D., U.C.P.D., BART P.D. and Albany P.D. I instructed Sergeant Ahearn to form a skirmish line at the east side of MLK at Berkeley Way and sweep the crowd of protestors east to Bonita St.

While this maneuver was being completed, a number of individuals resisted and interfered with the police line and were ultimately arrested (police reports from individual officers covering these arrests are attached). During the process of using the skirmish line, when it neared Bonita St., several bottles were thrown at the skirmish line of officers from the crowd of demonstrators. There were no injuries.

While there were sufficient officers to clear the street and provide a safe zone for the police van and the three arrests, there were insufficient officers to hold the crowd at MLK and Berkeley Way or to continue making arrests. It was at this time that all off-duty Crowd Management Team officers were called from home and responded to the scene.

Over the next four hours, after gathering nearly 60 officers, the arrests resumed. There were several incidents outside when individuals attempted to interfere with the arrests and were themselves arrested. All these individual arrests are part of the above captioned eleven and individual supplemental reports have been made on each and are attached.


At about 0100 hours, the arrests had been completed and the streets returned to normal.

SUMMARY:

Garland Ganter, the General Manager of KPFA Radio, reports the victim of criminal trespass by the individuals arrested and listed below.

INVESTIGATION:

Just after the above time of report, Officers from the Berkeley Police Department went to KPFA Radio Station at 1929 Martin Luther King Jr. Way. BPD Officers became embroiled in a large, unscheduled demonstration in front of the radio station. A large group of demonstrators managed to make their way into the offices and sound booths of the station. Lt. Lopes gave a legal dispersal order to those inside the station; Lt. Lopes gave this order twice. Also, Ganter gave a verbal order to the crowd to leave or he would sign citizen's arrest forms, arresting them for criminal trespass. When the Berkeley Police Department's Crowd Management Team (CMT) arrived, individual officers from CMT escorted the arrested individuals inside the station.

DURING THE ATTEMPT TO WALK THE PRISONERS TO THE VAN I WAS IN THE NARROW WALKWAY LEADING TO THE SIDEWALK, AND ATTEMPTING TO FROM A POLICE LINE TO CLEAR A PATH TO THE VAN. AS WE ASKED PEOPLE TO MOVE AND FORMED THE LINE, AR ANDERSON, REPEATEDLY TRIED TO PUSH HIS WAY THROUGH THE OFFICERS. HE WAS TOLD SEVERAL TIMES TO STOP OR HE WOULD BE ARRESTED, BUT CONTINUED TO PUSH INTO THE OFFICERS.

I STEPPED UP TO ASSIST AND GRABBED ANDERSON WHEN HE MADE ANOTHER ATTEMPT TO GET THROUGH THE LINE. I PULLED HIM BEHIND THE LINE AND ADVISED HIM THAT HE WAS UNDER ARREST FOR INTERFERING WITH POLICE OFFICERS ATTEMPTING TO DO THEIR DUTY. HE BEGAN TO STRUGGLE BY SWINGING HIS ARMS AND TRYING TO KICK HIS FEET, BUT WAS HANDCUFFED WITHOUT INCIDENT. HE WAS PLACED IN THE ARREST VAN AND TRANSPORTED TO THE HALL OF JUSTICE. AT THE END OF THE EVENT I WENT TO THE HOLDING AREA AND IDENTIFIED ANDERSON AS THE PERSON I ARRESTED. HE WAS GIVEN A CITATION AND ESCORTED OUT OF THE BUILDING.

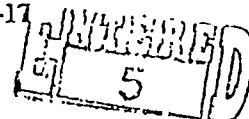

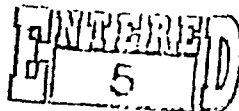

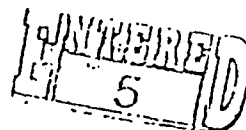
